Randy had originally wanted a 1961 Chrysler, but could not find one. He recalls his first car (white Chrysler) that he went 50/50 on with his Dad. Dad said he (Randy) owned the trunk. After a little coaxing from his Mom, Randy was allowed to drive the "great white beauty". Randy finally got his chance and headed for Manhattan. He went up the East River Drive, down the West Side Highway and then to the Brooklyn Queens Expressway. Randy saw what he thought was a small puddle on the road, that in fact turned out to be "a pond". When he hit the pothole, the mufflers flew off like rockets and he shot forward like an astronaut and with no control of the vehicle. He finally got the car slowed down and coasted off to the side of the road when the motor stopped running.

At the first attempt the car would not restart and Randy could only imagine what his father would think when he got home. After some praying, the car started, but did not have the nice purr it had before losing the mufflers! He learned a lot of the do's and don'ts of learning to drive (especially in New York City in the 60's).

Information taken from the *Encyclopedia of American Cars* notes that there were 11431 Chrysler 300's built in 1962. They weighed in at 3750 pounds and cost \$3323. The vehicle had a 122 inch wheel base. Also noted was that 1962 was very similar to the 1961 models, but were dubbed "plucked chickens" as the only really noticeable difference was the lack of fins. The four models of the 300's were non-lettered and all of them had the engine as the former Windsor. It did have the option of a center console and front bucket seats. The non-lettered cars hurt the sales of the 300H series-mainly because of the extra \$1600-\$1800 cost.

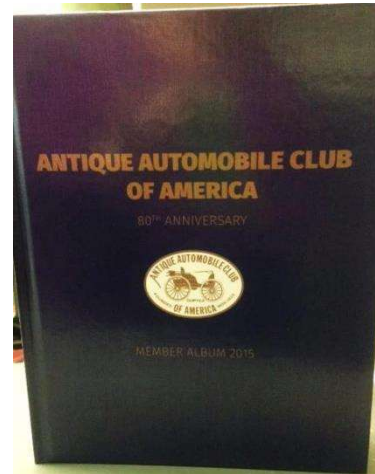

BILL REINTRODUCED

"Legislation (H.B. 1614) has been reintroduced in Pennsylvania to extend the emission inspection exemption to vehicles never before registered in the state or any other jurisdiction for ten years from the date of original registration. Current law only exempts new vehicles that less than 5, 000 miles on their odometer for one year after their first registration.

Highlights of the bill are:

- H.B. 1614 acknowledges the relatively minimal environmental impact of the new vehicles targeted for this exemption.
- H.B. 1614 acknowledges that it is senseless to test newer vehicles, the results of which demonstrate no significant air quality benefits. The idea behind exempting any class of vehicles is to reduce costs while not losing appreciable emission reductions. This strategy builds support for emission inspection programs, but also directs finite resources to where they will be most valuable in cleaning the air.
- H.B. 1614 still requires that the newest ten model year vehicles be subject to visual anti-tampering inspections for the presence of emission control components installed on the vehicle by manufacturers.

- Pennsylvania already exempts pre-1975 vehicles from emissions testing. The logic for this trend is unclear; such vehicles do not contribute in significant ways to air quality problems. This logic applies equally to newer cars.

All are urged to contact members of the Pennsylvania House Transportation Committee requesting support for H.B. 1614.

The episode name was EP 809: Ramblin' Man and featured Wayne Carini. 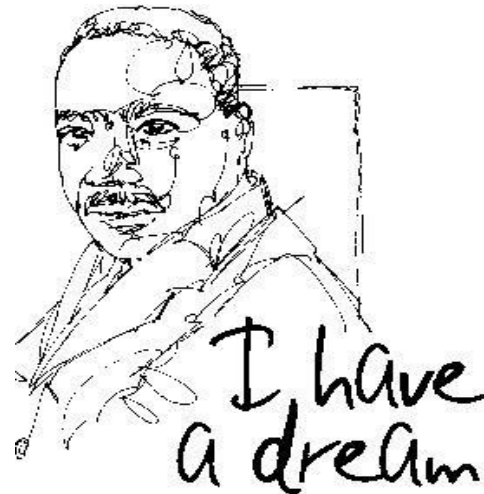

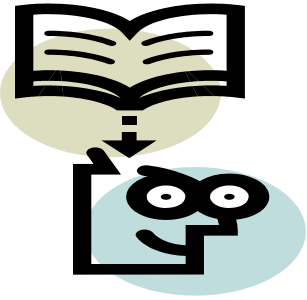
